- 3. Councillor's Update: Councillor Wilson unable to attend
- 4. Police Update: Sgt. Butt congratulated Councillor Wilson on her re-election to city council and looks forward to continuing to work with her in her role as the Ward 1 councillor. Crime stats reported from Jan-Oct 31 this year continue to be low compared to previous years. B&Es and Theft from Auto are the main reported occurrences. Sgt. Butt advised of staffing challenges across the HPS with need to reassign officers to front line duties through to next year from other units. Some units have been dismantled as a result. There was a spike in reported occurrences in October (24) some being linked to other areas in the city and the GTA. Use of a new crime analysis system, Dashboard Data Base provides police with live alerts and trends so they can respond quicker. Several projects initiated in response to high collision rates on Main St. and intersections have resulted in tickets issued. Main and Dundurn intersection is a design issue that contributes to high number of collisions which police presence alone can't effect change. Other successful projects to address B&Es shared with committee.
